

While it's not exactly a hop, skip and a jump from the racetrack to downtown Dallas, traffic generally isn't bad. And when you get there, you'll be rewarded with extensive dining and sightseeing options. The El Fenix / Meso Maya restaurant is a Dallas Tex-Mex must-try. And we recommend two places for a fascinating U.S. history fix. The Fort Worth Stockyards is an operating cattle stockyard where farmers buy and sell cattle. The area still has cobblestone roads and hotels dating back to

the 19th century, making for an immersive mid- to late-19th century Texas experience. Dealey Plaza is where President Kennedy lost his life. And the area is still very much as it was that day with the addition of a museum and shops that tell the story of that chapter in American history. Due to Federal and State COVID restrictions, some local options are operating differently than usual. Be sure to check with each establishment before visiting.
